GUEST SPEAKER - UTILIZING ONTARIO'S CONSERVATION FIRST FRAMEWORK



Our guest speaker for the evening will be Mr. Jeff Scott of Enwin Utilities Limited. Jeff is a graduate of St. Clair College in Windsor Ontario, majoring in Business Administration – Accounting, and has received his Certified Energy Manager and Certified Measurement & Verification Professional designations from the Association of Energy Engineers.

As the Key Accounts & Outreach Manager for Energy Conservation and Demand Management with Enwin Utilities, Jeff acts as a key relationship manager between EnWin Utilities and their large distribution consumers and is focused on assisting customers in overcoming traditional barriers related to energy management while creating a culture of conservation within their facilities. This is accomplished by helping them achieve energy savings through

relationship building and acting as a resource of knowledge. Jeff spent over 15 years working in the compressed air & gas industry focusing on energy efficient system designs.

Jeff is actively involved with several provincial committees relating to conservation program revisions and design, and recently led the redesign of the provincial Energy Manager Program. Jeff is the Chairman of the Energy Manager Steering Committee of Ontario.

Presentation Description: Energy Conservation programs in the province of Ontario are not going away! In fact, to remain on track to achieve the provinces Long Term Energy Plan (LTEP), the Conservation First Framework will enable the achievement of all cost-effective conservation and foster innovation through information sharing and the adoption of new technologies and approaches, including innovation performance management structures to drive greater energy savings until the end of 2020. Jeff will explain the provincial focus on conservation and provide an overview of the provincial incentive programs available to Ontario businesses.

Lets extend a warm welcome to Mr. Fudge during his time in Windsor and thank him for his efforts in travelling to visit our Chapter.




TABLE TOP DISPLAY




New ASHRAE Windsor Website Launch


