WOHIS can provide workplace walk-through surveys and assessments and some industrial hygiene and



Codes and Standards NATIONAL BUILDING MODEL CODES GET MAJOR REVISION

The Canadian Commission on Building and Fire Codes has published a revision to the National Building Code (NBC) that includes new provisions for the use of automatic sprinklers and for mechanical ventilation for houses, according to "Construction Innovation," a quarterly newsletter issued by the Institute for Research in Construction.

The 1995 model codes would require, if adopted into law by a province, territory or municipality, sprinklers in residential buildings of more than three stories, and in some institutional buildings. Mandates for sprinkler installation in existing buildings are not included in the model.

Mechanical ventilation of houses is dealt with in CSA Standard F326, which is referenced in the new code. In addition to this performance-based standard, the model code includes alternative, prescriptively described systems. The model code also includes a prescriptive path that specifies that the principal exhaust fan in the mechanical ventilation system must have a capacity of 50-percent of the required system capacity.





The Canadian Codes Centre of the 'nstitute for Research in Construction .RC) is providing a number of new services for people with online access.

The second new service is providing, also via email, a series of information bulletins to individuals who register for to receive code updates. The Canadian Codes Centre is also in the process of establishing a number of task groups to evaluate the offectiveness of using the Internet as means of facilitating committee work. Initial studies indicate that there are opportunities for significant cost savings and increases in efficiencies through the use of these technologies, according to the IRC.

ACCEPTABLE ALTERNATIVE TO HCFCS IDENTIFIED

R-508

R-508, which contains HFC-23 and R-116, is acceptable as a substitute for CFC-13, R-13B1 and R-503 in retrofitted and new very-low-temperature refrigeration. Although this blend is nonflammable and does not deplete the stratospheric ozone, EPA believes this blend could significantly contribute to global warming if allowed to escape refrigeration systems. This blend, like all substitutes is prohibited from being intentionally vented into the atmosphere.

R-411A and R-411B

These two blends, which consist of HCFC-22, HFC-152a and propylene. are acceptable as substitutes for CFC-12 and R-502 in reciprocating chillers. industrial process refrigeration, cold storage warehouses, refrigerated transport, retail food refrigeration, commercial ice machines, vending machines, and water coolers

HCFC-22 contributes to ozone depletion, but to a much lesser degree than CFC-12. This blend poses less of a threat to the ozone layer than HCFC-22, which has already been listed as an acceptable substitute for CFC-12. The global warming potential (GWP) of HCFC-22 is somewhat high, according to EPA, but the GWP of HFC-152a is low. Although propylene and HFC- commercial air conditioning. 152a are flammable, R-411A and B have been designated as A1/A2 refrigerants by ASHRAE (i.e., formulated nonflammable but can become flammable under worst-case fractionation). Leaks from the liquid phase do not become flammable, regardless of the amount leaked.

HCFC Blend Beta

This blend consists of HCFC-124. HFC-134a and butane, and is acceptable for CFC-12 in new and retrofitted reciprocating chillers, industrial process refrigeration, cold storage warehouses, refrigerated transport, retail food refrigeration, vending machines, water coolers, commercial ice machines, and in household refrigerators, freezers and dehumidifiers.

Although this blend contributes to global ozone depletion, it does so to a much lesser extent than CFC-12 HCFC-124 has an ozone depletion potential (ODP) much lower than HCFC-22, which has already been listed as an acceptable substitute for CFC-12. The GWPs of the components are moderate-to-low, and the blend is nonflammable

R-407C

This blend consists of HFC-32. HFC-134a and HFC-125. R-407C is an acceptable substitute for HCFC-22 in new and retrofit equipment in centrifugal, reciprocating and screw chillers, industrial refrigeration, very-lowtemperature industrial process refrigeration, ice skating rinks, refrigerated transport, retail food refrigeration systems, cold storage warehouses, vending machines, water coolers, commercial ice machines, houshold refrigerators and freezers, residential humidifiers, and household and light

This blend is not flammable when used in these end-uses while maintaining as-formulated composition or after leak conditions.

HFC-134a

HFC-134a is acceptable as a substitute for HCFC-22 in new household and light commercial air conditioning. HFC-134a exhibits a moderate-to-high global warming potential compared to other HFCs.

ASHRAE ACTIONS

· The Society committee charged with revising ASHRAE Standard 90.1-1989 met late last vear and unanimously voted out a draft for public review, which was subsequently approved by ASHRAE's Standards Project Liaison Subcommittee. A public review draft is in the March issue of the ASHRAF Journal (see p. 68).

The existing standard provides minimum energy efficiency requirements for the construction of new buildings. The revised standard will be issued in a format intended to ease its incorporation into state and local regulations as a standard.

Once the Society finalizes the revised standard, federal law requires the U.S. Department of Energy to consider using the ASHRAE efficiency requirements to revise mandatory national standards.
